Spotlight on: *Jennifer Menard*

I started the phone interview with Jen from the Pacific NW, mountains, and 20 degrees with nearly 2 feet of snow on the ground. Happy Washington State winter! With such a large membership we have a tremendous opportunity to give back to our membership and represent eChapter in many capacities, through charity designations, endowed scholarship, and Foundation donations and funding eligible delegates and grant winners. She has been doing a fabulous job. But what is this amazing nurse come from? What's her story?

She attended Wenatchee College in Wenatchee WA. After graduation she was given choices of the ER or the OR, and she wisely chose the OR. Jen also touts two friends from nursing school (Ashley and Rachel) who have remained lifelong friends and supporters of each other. It's so amazing that bonds we form in school remain strong through the years.

She started her career life as a Licensed Veterinary Tech and then started working part time in her local hospital in the lab for extra \$. While she enjoyed meeting everyone and working in both animal and human worlds, she decided after 5 years that she wanted to learn new things and branch out, and make more money. When seeking new opportunities in nursing her lab cohorts warned her that "Nurses eat their young", but she went ahead with her career path anyway, bolstered by her sisters who were nurses (one being her twin). They encouraged her to go to nursing school.

She completed a 16 week training program, and 3 month orientation to the OR in her current hospital and has since assumed duties as Neuro/Spine team lead, and relief charge nurse duties. Jen never did experience negativity in her workplace and has continued to be supported by her OR leadership and influencers who encourage her to demonstrate hands-on leadership, support teamwork, and appreciate everyone's contribution to the patient care. The principles of being approachable and fair (when doing charge duties) have paid off. Employees and even travel nurses respond positively to their work environment.

Her involvement in AORN and eChapter was a result of her OR Director's encouragement to grow and become more involved in the ways of the Operating Room Nurse. Since Jen has grown in her experiences and leadership, she would advise new nurses to be open to change, be aware of the fast-pace of new technology and new advanced in equipment. It's crucial to learn from others, but not let the job be your only focus in life. Be sure to take your vacation time. Her thoughts on improving eChapter are to reach out to young nurses to expand the chapter more and use all means of social media to gain influence in the nursing community. She also feels it's important for administrators in hospitals to encourage and send their engaged AORN members to EXPO more often.

Speaking of life outside of work, Jen has 2 dogs and a cat. She love corgis and Deuce is 12 years old, Tripp is 2 years old—both are Pembroke Corgis... and then she has the cat. The cat is a rescue from a dump truck trailer—her husband brought it home when he discovered meowing from the truck's trailer, and this 3 week-old cat stuck its head out from one of the trailer's openings.
